4 The meal service was not structured to comply with the meal pattern requirements of the multiple grade groups. Specifically, Head Start classroom was not comingled with the rest of the school at Maxine O Bush Elementary School, CACFP meal pattern was followed but separate production records were not kept for Head Start.

Discussed allowable meal pattern grade groups per the grades served and feasible options for structuring the meal service to comply with quantity requirements (e.g., recipes changes, portion size changes, how to differentiate between students in different groups).
