- May August: PPPSS Surveys
- October December: October 1 data
- January May: Parent Involvement Survey
- May July: Exiting/Discipline/Preschool Transition/Students Without Disabilities
- July 15: SPED Data Due in AzEDS










AzEDS SPED72 Report







Preschool Outcomes

- Three Entry Scores: Beginning LRE start date at a school
- Three Exit Scores: Ending LRE exit date at a school
- Progress Made: Yes or No reported on each exit outcome
- Example:


John starts preschool on 8/5/2024 and ends the preschool year on 5/2/2025.

Jane starts preschool on 8/5/2024 and ends on 12/31/2024, starts a new preschool within the district on 1/13/2024, and ends the preschool year on 5/2/2025.



Coordinated Early Intervening Services

- PEAs are allowed to use up to 15% of their IDEA grant fund to implement early intervening services
- All CEIS/CCEIS activities should be reported in AzEDS. All students impacted by these funds should be reflected.
- CEIS-CCEIS are reported in the support section, likely in the same area your SIS reports Title 1
- Verify entry on the SUPP10: Support Program Data Verification Report

October 1 Data Collection (ODC)

- Annual Student and Personnel Count
 - Why?
 - What?
 - Who?
 - Where?
 - When?

October 1 Data Collection (Why)

Why must I complete ODC?

- Determines base funding for Federal Part B
 - Allocations for PEAs and the State
- Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (2004), Section 618
 - Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP)
- Adjustments for new or expanding charter schools
- Government Performance and Results (GPRA) Indicators

October 1 Data Collection (What)

What (who) am I counting?

- Students
 - Enrolled and receiving SPED services on October 1
 - Ages 3 21 as of October 1
 - Data collected by District of Residence (DOR)
 - Unduplicated count by Federal Primary Need Indicator (FPNI)
- Personnel
 - Teachers, paraprofessionals, and related service providers on October 1
 - Based on FTE status

October 1 Data Collection (Who)

Who is required to complete ODC?

- Student counts
 - Public School Districts
 - Public Charters
 - Secure Care Facilities
 - Arizona Department of Corrections
 - Arizona Department of Juvenile Corrections
 - County Juvenile Detention Centers
 - County Jails
- Personnel counts
 - All agencies above, in addition to approved private special education schools and approved residential treatment centers.

October 1 Data Collection (How) 1 of 3

How do I count my students and personnel?

- Students
 - Head count
 - Rosters
 - Internal reports/queries
- Personnel
 - Employed or contracted
 - Works with SPED students ages 3-21
 - Total FTE

Do not rely on AzEDS reports.

October 1 Data Collection (How) 2 of 3

How do I access the ODC application?

- ADEConnect Role
 - ESS October 1 Data Collection: LEA User
 - Allows access to the ODC application
 - Ability to enter and review data and reports in ODC
 - ESS October 1 Data Collection: LEA Signer
 - All the above, in addition to sign off on submitted data.
 - Reserved only for SPED Directors, Superintendents, CEOs, Business Managers, Charter Holders, or equivalent titles

October 1 Data Collection (When)

When do I need to complete ODC?

- Phase I: Verification Count
 - 5:00 PM, November 6, 2024
- Phase II: Reconciliation
 - 5:00 PM, December 11, 2024
- Phase III: Non-Reconciliation (Conditional)
 - 5:00 PM, February 5, 2025
- ESS Data Management Important Dates

October 1 Data Collection (How) 3 of 3


How do I submit this data and complete ODC?

- Phase I: Verification Count
 - Manually enter data in the ODC application
- Phase II: Reconciliation
 - Ensure proper reporting in your SIS
 - No integrity errors
 - Needs and Programs (LREs) are accurate
 - Cross-reference your records with reports available in AzEDS and ODC
- Phase III: Non-Reconciliation (Conditional)
 - Justify mismatch between Phase I and Phase II counts in ODC





Special Education Data Dashboard

Special Education Data Dashboard (SEDD)

- Federal Reporting Requirement under IDEA Section 618
- All Public Education Agencies (PEAs) are required to complete SEDD, which includes Data Certification
- Data Review
 - SPED Discipline Data
 - SPED Exit Data
- Data Entry (if applicable)
 - Preschool Transition
 - Students Without Disabilities (SWOD)

SEDD: Discipline

- Removals to an Interim Alternative Educational Setting (IAES) for drugs, weapons, and/or serious bodily injury for not more than 45 days
- Hearing officer removals regarding the likely injury to student or others
- In-school suspensions
- Out-of-school suspensions
- Expulsions

SEDD Discipline: AzEDS Reports

- INTEG15: Student Data Integrity
- INTEG55: Discipline Integrity
- DISC10: Discipline Verification
- DISC72: Discipline Validation

SEDD: Exit

- Only students enrolled in SPED services on the first day of the school year AND not enrolled in SPED services at the end of the reporting year
 - Arizona Online Instruction (AOI) and Dropout Recovery Program (DRP): eight weeks
- Ages 14–21 (based on October 1)
- Unduplicated count of SPED Students based on Federal Primary Need
- Last known exit must be one of these six Federal Exit Categories
 - Transferred to regular education
 - Graduated with a high school diploma
 - Reached maximum age
 - Died
 - Moved (known to be continuing) and did not continue in a SPED program until the end of the year at another PEA
 - Dropped out

SEDD Exit: AzEDS Reports

- INTEG15: Student Data Integrity
- SPED72: SPED Participation
- SPED74: SPED Exit

SEDD: Students Without Disabilities (SWOD)

- Grades K–12
- Expulsion is an action taken by the PEA to remove a student from their regular school for disciplinary purposes for the remainder of the school year
- Educational services during expulsion (W3 exit code)
- Did or did not receive services during removal

SEDD: Preschool Transition

Children referred by Part C before age 3 who were found to be eligible for Part B


- Have an IEP developed and implemented by their 3rd birthday
- Were found to be not eligible by their 3rd birthday
- Children who have reached their 3rd birthday between July 1 June 30 of the reporting year
- Children for whom the school district received a PEA (public education agency) notification

SEDD: Accessing the Application



- Make sure you select the Parent Entity
- Exceptional Students Services Portal
- Two roles available:
 - ESS SEDD: LEA User or LEA Signer role
 - LEA Signer should be assigned to SPED Director

SEDD: Application



SEDD: Important Dates

- Data entry and validation occurs throughout the year
- Application Opens: May 7, 2025
- Data Validation/Entry Period Closes: July 15, 2025
- Certification Period: July 23 –August 6, 2025

July 15, 2025: AzEDS Data is Final

 Student Level Special Education Data Reporting Deadline

 Special Education Discipline Data Incident Reporting Deadline Beginning of the Year: FY2025

Surveys

Annual Surveys to Complete

- Statement of Assurance
 - All PEAs must complete before the beginning of the reporting year
 - Due June 11, 2025
- Parentally Placed Private School Student Survey
 - Due August 13, 2025
- Parent Involvement Survey
 - Due May 31, 2025

- Required annual federal special education data collection
- Overseen by the Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP)
- Outlined under a variety of sections in the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA)

Exceptional Student Services (ESS) reports on portions of this information to stakeholders throughout the year.



How the SPP Is Different From the APR

- State Performance Plan (SPP) is a six-year performance plan
- Evaluates the State's efforts to implement the requirements and purposes of the IDEA
- Includes updates through the Annual Performance Report (APR), submitted each February to OSEP
- SY 2020-2021 was the start of the next six-year reporting cycle





How the SPP/APR Data Is Used

- Data is reported on our website and in stakeholder meetings
- Information is used in identifying and exploring trends and fluctuations
- Data-informed decisions on how to best assist children with disabilities in Arizona
