Activity Description

Students are guided on how to find their local, regional, and national library resources (i.e., in-person, online, and bookmobiles). Public libraries enhance children's reading skills, social skills, and literacy development, all of which can have lifelong impacts.

Title of Activity What's Next?

Activity Description

Students work together in teams of 4 to create art without an expected outcome. The activity starts with each student drawing something on paper. The author explains their work and others contribute a second, third, etc. drawing until the artwork is complete.



<u>Desired Outcomes</u> Students use creative ways to communicate career-related vocabulary words and help other students understand.

Activity Description

Students collaborate on a challenge to build a structure that will hold a book for the longest time. The structure must be 6" above the table and hold for at least 10 seconds.

Title of Activity Learn about future possibilities

Activity Description

Students are introduced to day-in-the life career videos. Students develop career choices and accept that the choices they make today may change as they grow. Career-related activities are completed by students once a week.

Display Examples:

Farming – hands-on projects, books, videos, coloring sheets.

Education – educator acts out a "day-in-the-life" scenario for students to roleplay.


Library Career Awareness

Activity Title Build a Bridge Project

Activity Description

The librarian reviews how problem-solving skills, creativity, collaboration, and communication are important to teamwork. In teams, students will construct a bridge made out of popsicle sticks, and record the angles and dimensions of the structure. Students will display their bridges at Open house.

A mechanical engineer to speak to the class.

Desired Outcomes

Students practice collaboration, problem-solving, creativity, and courteous communication skills. Students will decide on the kind of bridge they will make (suspension bridge, draw bridge, or truss bridge) Students will build a structure within 2-3 class periods. Students will measure angles and dimensions to create a schematic of their bridge.
