



Over the past 5 years, the percentage of K-12 students enrolled in special education has slightly increased.




In school year 2023-24, the most common primary disability among K-12 SWD was specific learning disability (SLD).

5-Year Trend, % K-12 SWD with SLD




Over the past 5 years, the percentage of K-12 SWD with a specific learning disability (SLD) has decreased by 3% while the number of enrolled SPED students has increased.

5-Year Trend, % K-12 SWD with SLI





5-Year Trend, % K-12 SWD with A




Over the past 5 years, the percentage of K-12 SWD with autism (A) has increased along with the number of enrolled SPED students.

5-Year Trend, % K-12 SWD with OHI




Over the past 5 years, the percentage of K-12 SWD with other health impairment (OHI) has increased along with the number of enrolled SPED students.

Over the past 5 years, the percentage of K-12 SWD with a developmental delay (DD) has remained relatively consistent while the number of enrolled SPED students has increased.




5-Year Trend, % K-12 SWD with ED or EDP





5-Year Trend, % K-12 SWD with OI or TBI





% K-12 SWD in LRE A or B



The percentage of K-12 SWD who spend between 79% and 40% of their day in the regular class has remained relatively consistent.


% K-12 SWD in LRE C or D







5-Year Trend, % Preschool CWD with DD





5-Year Trend, % Preschool CWD with SLI




Over the past 5 years, the percentage of preschool CWD with a speech/language impairment (SLI) has decreased while the number of enrolled SPED students has increased.

Over the past 5 years, the percentage of preschool CWD with preschool severe delay (PSD) has increased along with the number of enrolled SPED students.


5-Year Trend, % Preschool CWD with HI, VI, or DB


SY 2023-24, Preschool CWD by LRE

5-Year Trend, % Preschool CWD in a Separate Setting




Over the past 5 years, the percentage of preschool CWD in a separate setting has decreased.
