7 Foods and beverages sold to students in grades 9-12 during the school day do not meet Smart Snacks Standards. Specifically, Gatorade, Capri Sun, and Brisk Iced Tea exceeded 60 calories per 12 fluid ounces. Additionally, Goldfish Cheddar Crackers and Dill Pickle exceeded 200mg sodium and Italian Ice did not meet any of the general nutrition standards for Smart Snacks."
