

AUTHORITY



AUTHORITY – IDENTIFYING EL STUDENTS

The federal law that mandates a state to provide an annual assessment of English language proficiency is under *Every Student Succeeds Act* Sec. 1111.

Arizona State Statutes refer to the identification and reclassification of English learners.

15-756. Identification of English language learners.

15-756.05. Reassessment and reclassification of English language learners.

AUTHORITY – IDENTIFYING EL STUDENTS

Furthermore, the **U.S. Department of Justice** describes conditions under which a school or state may violate the Equal Educational Opportunities Act:

- 1. fails to take steps to identify students who are not proficient in English;
- 2. exits ELL students before the students acquire English proficiency from ELL services.

AUTHORITY – IDENTIFYING EL STUDENTS

The **Office for Civil Rights** visits Arizona schools and districts every Fiscal Year to ensure they are complying with **Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964**. Included is *Identifying English learner (EL) students in a timely manner and to adequately notify their parents of their EL status and their ability to receive or opt out of the English Language Development (ELD) program.*

Two laws have far-reaching legal implications for state and local policies and procedures that guide the procedures by which education records can be released and protected.

State and local education agencies and institutions that receive state and federal funds must adhere to the *federal privacy laws pertaining to education record of students.*

FERPA establishes additional basic **disclosure restrictions** that guide the treatment of any information collected in schools if the information either derives from education records or is maintained in those records for any period of time.

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and the Protection of Pupil Rights
Amendment (PPRA) govern data collection by schools, districts, and state education agencies.

US Code Title 34 Chapter 33 U.S. Federal Registry

AUTHORITY – STUDENT PRIVACY - IDEA

IDEA protects the privacy of students who are receiving special education services.

In addition to the requirements of FERPA, the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) provides additional privacy protections for students who are receiving special education and related services. The privacy protection under Part B of the IDEA are found at 34 CFR 300.560-300.577.

Part B of the IDEA incorporates and cross-references FERPA. For example, under Part B, "education records" is broadly defined to mean those records that are related to a student and are maintained by an education agency or institution.

Part C (34 CFR 303.460) permits states to adopt or develop policies that the states will follow to ensure the confidentiality of personally identifiable information.

Accommodated ELP test data is included on the EL70, EL72, and EL73 Reports.

LEGITIMATE EDUCATIONAL INTEREST

FERPA permits the disclosure of student education records information to school officials who have a legitimate educational interest in the information.

Access to students' EL70 – ELP Student Test History Report is limited to districts who have a current school enrollment transaction that has passed Integrity.



TIMING AND ACCESS



OPENING THE DOOR

Access to the Assessments EL Reports is dependent on two things (in this order):

- 1. When the district's Fiscal Year calendar has been approved by School Finance.
- 2. When school registrars enter the school enrollments into the district's Student Information System (SIS).
- This data must be **synchronized to AzEDS** so that the enrollments pass integrity with School Finance. You should find the answers to the following questions:
 - When and how often do school registrars complete the school enrollment transactions in your SIS?
 - When and how often does the SIS synchronize with AzEDS?



AZEDS

Confirmation of students' school enrollments is verified through the AzEDS Portal. Access to the AzEDS Portal is protected and limited.



ACCESS

Authorized users for the Assessments ELP Reports must have an ADEConnect account.

- ◆ AZELLA District Test Coordinator role (1 per district)
- ♦ ELL role

Authorized users may access a student's EL70 Report:

- up to two (2) calendar weeks **prior** to the student's **Start of School** date **only** when the student's school enrollment transaction has passed integrity. Otherwise, access is granted the day after the date the student's school enrollment transaction passed integrity.
- for two (2) calendar weeks **after** the student has withdrawn from school or the *last day of instruction* of the school year.




STUDENT ANALYSIS

Students Analysis provides more detailed answers to the question about when the EL70 Report can be accessed by authorized users who have a legitimate educational interest in the student.

Start Date – Student's 1st day of school

Create Date – Date the enrollment transaction synchronized from the SIS and processed through AzEDS

STUDENT ANALYSIS CONT.



Compare the **Start Date** to the **Create Date**. When the Create Date is earlier than the Start Date, authorized users **have access to the student's EL70 Report before the student arrives for their first day of school,** thus allowing for time to determine if the student needs to be administered a new ELP test as well as placing the student in the most appropriate instructional classroom(s).



Both schools completed the student's enrollments prior to their start date; therefore, they had access to the EL70 Report prior to the student starting school.

STUDENT ANALYSIS – START AND CREATE DATES

This example shows that the **Create Date was after** the Start Date.

The earliest an authorized user will gain access to the student's EL70 Report is the **day after the Create Date** because the student has already started school, but the school enrollment was not processed and had not passed Integrity before the student started school.



The school enrollment transaction happened a week after the student started school; therefore, access to the student's EL70 Report was on August 16th.

WHY IS THIS IMPORTANT? TEST ADMINISTRATION COMPLIANCE

Has this student ever been administered an Arizona ELP test?

Does this student have an EL need?

Has this student ever had an EL need in the past but is now proficient?

Does this student require the administration of a new AZELLA Placement Test?

Does this student have a "current" and "eligible for EL services" test record?

The answers to all these questions are on the student's **EL70 Report.**

When care and adherence to the established protocols are not exercised when determining which students are eligible to test, this can result not only in testing students unnecessarily, but also in a potential misuse of state AZELLA funds.

COMPLIANCE TIME FRAMES

The compliance time frames for administering the AZELLA Placement Test commences on the district's first day of student instruction.

ADE provides a 2-week jump start before the 1st day of school.

• Does not count toward the required testing time frame.

30-calendar days or 60-calendar days compliance is dependent on Title I and/or Title III funds.


 ONLY for new to Arizona students who have never been administered an AZ ELP test and start school on the 1st day of school.

2-calendar week compliance.

- New to Arizona students who have never been administered an AZ ELP test and start school on the 2nd day of school or later.
- EL students who require the administration of a new AZELLA Placement Test.
- EL students with an approved AZELLA Placement Test referral form.


PLANNING





Review district's policy and procedures for student enrollment data entered in the SIS and synchronized to AzEDS. This should be **occurring daily.**

Access to student's EL70 Reports and students appearing on the EL73 Report is completely **dependent on the district synchronizing school enrollments to AzEDS.**



Completing and synchronizing school enrollments in a timely manner is critical for **test administration compliance**, including identifying students who require the administration of an Arizona ELP test and notifying parents of the results of the test.

Testing students who are not eligible for an ELP test is not only a test administration irregularity, but most importantly, it is a test security violation.

Ensure all new student school enrollments have their EL70 Report downloaded and reviewed.

Download and review the EL73 Report weekly and save the report on the last day of the school year.

District should retain all Pearson provided reports and SDFs as they become available.

PLANNING



Passing Integrity

Passing integrity means that the eligible ELP test record must be dated **BEFORE** (not the same day) the date of the EL services enrollment transaction.


Student **must** have a **current** and **eligible for EL services** ELP test record.

Current: The student's most current ELP record must be dated during the current school year or the prior school year.

Eligible for EL Services: The Overall Proficiency Level of the "current" ELP record must be less than Proficient but not Undetermined.

Students cannot be enrolled in 2 schools at the same time and enrolled in EL services at the same time. This will not pass integrity for EL services. A phone call to the student's former school may be needed to ensure the student has been exited from EL services.





Passing Integrity – Placement Test

When the current and eligible ELP record is from a **Placement Test**, the **earliest** date that can be entered for EL services enrollment transaction is **the day after** the eligible ELP record. This date can be any day of the week including weekends and holidays.

Example: The Placement Test record is the eligible record, and that test record date is August 1 of the current school year.

The earliest date than can be used to enroll the student in EL services is August 2 of the current school year.

- AZELLA Placement Test
- Alt ELPA Screener

When the current and eligible ELP record is from a Spring Reassessment Test (prior school year), the earliest date that can be entered for EL services enrollment transaction is the day the student enrolls in school for the current school year.

Example: The student has a current and eligible for EL Services test record from the prior school year - the Spring 2024 AZELLA Reassessment (February 1, 2024); therefore, the student can be enrolled in EL services for the 2024-2025 school year any day that the student is enrolled in school, including the first day of school (August 1, 2024).

- Spring AZELLA Reassessment
- Alt ELPA Summative
- ELPA21 Braille

Passing Integrity – Reassessment



Spring Reassessment results are published during the 1st week of MAY.

New Placement results are available within 2 days and the window closes mid-May.

Synchronize students **exit** from EL services **before the end of June.**

- Withdrawal from school (ELL02)
- End of school year (ELL06)
- Reclassification (ELL01)

Per FERPA, PPRA, and IDEA, district and school personnel may not share explicit student ELP results with another school outside of their own district.



REPORTS



EL REPORTS [70, 72 & 73]

ADE's Assessments EL Reports are the historical official English Language Proficiency (ELP) records for all students who have been administered AZ ELP tests and who have received EL services.

These reports provide valuable information for students' academic success.



The EL70 – ELP Student Test History Report

LOCATION OF REPORT

The EL70 – ELP Student Test History Report (EL70 Report) is in the Arizona Department of Education's ADEConnect dashboard under the Assessments application menu or through the AzEDS Portal under the English Learner section. An ADEConnect account is required with the role of **AZELLA District Test Coordinator** (one per district) or with an **ELL role or title** to be able to access the report.

ACCESSING THE STUDENT'S REPORT

All Arizona public students have an EL70 Report, regardless of the parent responses on their Home Language Surveys (HLS). The State Student ID (SSID) is required to access students' EL70 Reports. This is a single student report. It is imperative that all new students enrolling in the district or charter schools have their EL70 Report reviewed and download and/or printed. Students whose HLS only includes English or American Sign Language (ASL) responses and has an EL70 Report that provide an English Language proficiency (ELP) test history and/or EL program services transactions, must be reviewed for ELP testing and EL services eligibility. An ELP test history and EL program services ALWAYS supersedes an all-English HLS.

The EL70 Report will assist LEAs to determine students' eligibility for EL program services and assist educators as they develop students' educational plans. The testing history should reflect an initial AZELLA Placement Test followed by an annual Spring ELP Reassessment Test. Once students have an Overall Proficiency Level of Proficient, they are exited from the EL program and monitored for two years using the statewide academic assessments and other academic indicators. ELP tests are not used for monitoring purposes.

Authorized users can access a student's EL70 Report after the student's school enrollment has passed Integrity. The STUD10 – Student Data Verification Report from ADEConnect's AzEDS Portal can provide confirmation of a student's school enrollment. Authorized users can access the EL70 Reports as early as 2 weeks prior to the student's school start date. This is all dependent on when the student's school enrollment has passed Integrity. LEAs also have access for 2 weeks after a student has withdrawn from school or from the last day of the student's instructional school year. It is the district and charter's responsibility to process and synchronize students' school enrollments through AzEDS in a timely manner.



EL70 REPORT FOR ALL STUDENTS

- Every student in Arizona has an EL70 Report.
- All schools must review the EL70 Report for every student enrolled in school.
- Schools must download and save the EL70 Report for all students that have one or more of the following on the report:
 - Another language
 - Assessment History
 - Most Recent EL Program Transactions



CURRENT AND ELIGIBLE FOR EL SERVICES ELP RECORD



To be eligible for EL Services, a student must have a "current" and "Eligible for EL Services" ELP test record.

"Current" means the ELP test record is dated during the current school year or the prior school year.

"Eligible for EL Services" means the Overall Proficiency Level of the same ELP test record is less than proficient.

QUICK ALERT MESSAGES

ADE has 3 red font quick alerts messages and 1 blue font alert message on the EL70 Report.

Red alert indicates the student requires a new AZELLA Placement Test immediately. These students are listed on the EL73 Report as EL Group 8.

Blue alert indicates the student is not eligible for any AZELLA testing because the student was withdrawn due to SPED criteria in FY 2019 and earlier. The SPED Withdrawal retired with FY 2019.

EL72 – ELP TEST ROSTER REPORT

Current Fiscal Year plus 3 prior Fiscal Years are available in ADEConnect

Includes every ELP test administered to students in that district, reported school-by-school, during the report year.

This report does not vary based on changes in enrollment. For this report, the students always report in the district where they were tested.

The annual report is updated regularly throughout the school year and reflects all ELP test results as they are uploaded into ADE's student record system.

This report is available as a PDF and CSV file.

EL73 – EL STUDENT NEED REPORT

Live report that updates daily.

Displays all students in an LEA/school who have an EL need in the current Fiscal Year and those with an EL need that has not been addressed in prior years back through FY 2015.

This report is intended to be used in conjunction with the EL70 Reports to determine which students need to be placed into EL Services and reassessed.

EL students will show on the report **after** their school enrollment has been processed through AzEDS.

Can be considered the Spring Reassessment testing list.

Proficient students are not included in this report.

Valuable footnotes are included at the end of the report.
