





### School Guidance

Below is a summary of the key reporting requirements under ARS §15-746 and its referenced statutes. This guide is meant to help Arizona school leaders understand what incidents must be reported on the School Report Cards website (and, in many cases, to law enforcement).

#### Key Takeaway:

For the School Report Cards, you must report the total number of law-enforcement-supported incidents (with probable cause) that occur on your campus, school buses, school bus stops, or school events under the statutes that deal with drugs, child abuse, serious crimes, weapons violations, or other threats. Keeping a clear internal record and immediately involving law enforcement when required are essential for compliance with ARS §15-746 and its referenced statutes.

ARS 15-746 (A)(5): School Report Cards – Required Incident Reporting Schools must include in their annual report card:
