Introduction

In accordance with the Arizona Administrative Code's Article 15 Empowerment Scholarship Accounts, Rule 7-2-1503 (5) and (6), the Arizona Department of Education's Empowerment Scholarship Account program presents this quarterly report to the Arizona State Board of Education (SBE). Figure 1: Number of students by grade level




Figure 2: Number of students with a disability by grade level






Note: The number of applications received does not equal the sum of the applications approved and denied because some applications that we received were incomplete at the end of Quarter 4, but applicants still were within the timeframe to provide the necessary information to complete their applications. Additionally, some of the applications we received in Quarter 4 were incomplete and applicants never provided additional documents in the 30-day timeframe required by the ESA program to complete their applications, resulting in the applications being closed. These applications are not captured in either the approved or denied status categories. Lastly, some applicants submitted duplicate applications, which required ESA staff to disregard one of the

duplicated applications. These duplicated applications were included as "received" but not captured by either the approved or denied statuses.

¹ The average number of days to process applications in Quarter 3 and 4 is materially lower than in Quarter 2 due to fewer applications processed during Quarter 3 and 4. Many of the applications processed in Quarter 2 were spillover applications that were incomplete from Quarter 1, which had a heavy application volume. These Quarter 1 incomplete applications that spilled over into Quarter 2 (30-day window to complete the application did not close by end of Quarter 1) were not captured in our Quarter 2 report because we only reported on applications that were <u>both</u> received and processed (complete applications) within the same quarter. As a result, ESA staff processed far more applications in Quarter 2 than what was reported in that report's Tables 3 and 5.

ESA staff to complete a review of the ESA applications upon initial or subsequent application submissions. Ultimately, these applications were never completed during Quarter 4 and were approved or denied in Quarter 1 of fiscal year 2025. The incomplete ESA applications from fiscal year 2024 that were approved in fiscal year 2025 were approved for fiscal year 2025 funding and not for fiscal year 2024 Quarter 4 funding.

Our goal is to efficiently review and approve orders in a timely manner. We receive high volumes of reimbursement requests, which require more time and effort to review by ESA Staff. Additionally, the team is exploring strategies to address the high volume of reimbursement requests.
The processing time for purchases made through ClassWallet is currently experiencing a delay beyond the normal timeframe	The ESA team actively monitors and tracks order review times and strives to review orders as quickly as possible. Due to varying purchase volumes, there is not a normal timeframe for order reviews, as volume growth is the primary driving factor of review times. All ESA applications for enrollment are reviewed by an ESA employee and an ESA special investigator audits applications on a risk basis to ensure that all eligibility information presented is valid and true.

Purchases paid with ESA funds are reviewed by one or more ESA or ClassWallet employees to ensure that purchases are allowable. Approved purchases are further audited on a random and risk basis by an ESA employee to ensure the validity of approved purchases.

Data and narratives of audit finding outcomes from Quarter 4

The ESA program is working with ClassWallet to enhance purchase review functionality. These enhancements will include line-item purchase approval or denial, which currently does not exist for all payment methods on its platform. Presently, ESA purchase review staff must approve or deny orders in their entirety and cannot approve or deny individual items included in an order, for example those orders that are on a receipt submitted for reimbursement. When all payment methods allow for line-item approval or denial, the quarterly report following the total implementation of that functionality will include the total dollar value of items that were rejected because they were not allowable or adequate documentation was never provided.

⁴ The number of incomplete applications reported in the fiscal year 2024 Quarter 3 report was 1,270 applications at the end of Quarter 3. However, the reported number actually represented the total number of applications that were incomplete sometime during Quarter 3, rather than those still incomplete at the end of the quarter, as the number is presented in Quarter 4.

Average number of days to resolution

The Average number of days to resolution on escalated HelpDesk Tickets cannot be reported this quarter because of functionality limitations in the HelpDesk Ticket system used by ADE. These limitations do not allow ADE to pull the data from the system to report this number. In previous quarterly reports, the Average number of days to resolution number that we reported was not accurately capturing this measure. The previously reported numbers were only reporting HelpDesk tickets that had a final resolution and not those that ESA holders had submitted but that had not yet been resolved by the ESA program. Moreover, it should be noted that most of the written requests for assistance that the ESA program receives are submitted by email from ESA holders. Requests for assistance submitted through the HelpDesk Ticket system account for a small portion of the written requests submitted to the ESA program. There is currently no process or capacity to track resolutions for written requests that were submitted by email. As a result, the substantive measure sought by SBE cannot currently be captured by the ESA program.

Summary of resolutions

This requirement was first applicable in Quarter 3 of fiscal year 2023. The ESA program will work with the State Board of Education (SBE) to clarify what information SBE is seeking for this reporting requirement.

Updates on the bidding process for all eligible Department contracts

State Treasurer's contract with private financial management firm

The State Treasurer's office initiated a Request for Proposal on March 27, 2023. The contract was awarded to ClassWallet on August 1, 2023, and signed on March 7, 2024, by all parties. It took effect July 12, 2024.

Conducting or contracting for annual audits

The ESA program does not contract with a firm to audit purchases made by ESA account holders because those audits are done by ESA and financial solutions vendor staff.

Conducting or contracting for random, quarterly, and annual audits See response above.

Contracting with an independent third party for the purposes of determining whether a qualified student is eligible to receive educational therapies

In fiscal year 2023, Quarter 4, the Department of Education posted a Request for Proposal (RFP) on May 19, 2023, to solicit proposals from bidders to conduct independent third-party evaluations of qualified students to determine eligibility to receive educational therapies or services pursuant to A.R.S. §§15-2403(J) and 15-2402(B)(4)(c).

However, the Department cancelled the RFP on August 15, 2023, in the best interest of the State, because it was determined by statute that the contract must be competitively awarded to a single contractor. The RFP posted on May 19, 2023, allowed for multiple contractors to be awarded contracts, which necessitated its cancellation.

The Department of Education intends to develop an RFP to address this statutory requirement.

Contracting with a third-party to operate the call center

This portion of the Quarterly report is not applicable because the Department of Education currently has a dedicated ESA call center and does not contract with a third-party call center.

ESA annual award amounts are determined by calculating 90 percent of the amount a student would have received in state funding had the student attended his or her school district of residence. Annual ESA awards are based on 7 funding variables in the following formula:

((Support Level Weight + Group B Weight + ELL and MOWR Assistance Weight) X Base Amount X TEI X Grade Level Multiplier) + Charter Additional Assistance

 Support Level—additional per student funding for some students based on grade level and size of school district

- 2. **Group B**—additional funding for students with disabilities
- 3. English Language Learners (ELL) and/or K-3 reading (MOWR program) funding—additional per student funding authorized by state law for English Language Learners and for students in grades K-3 to ensure that students' reading levels are appropriate before moving to grade 4 (Move On When Reading or MOWR)
- 4. **Base Amount**—per student funding amount authorized by state law
- 5. **Teacher Experience Index (TEI)**—additional funding for some school districts that have a higher average level of teacher experience than the state average
- 6. **Grade Level Multiplier**—funding multiplier of the Base Amount depending on whether students are in preschool or kindergarten (.5 multiplier) or in grades 1-12 (1.0 multiplier)
- 7. Charter Additional Assistance—additional funding per student authorized by state law
