Mini-Grant Overview

The Character Education Matching Mini-Grant is authorized by Arizona Revised Statute (A.R.S.) 15-154.01. Its purpose is to provide funding schools for training on a character education curriculum pursuant to A.R.S. 15-719.

Eligibility and Requirements:

- Schools must provide matching monies from any lawful source in an amount that is equal to or greater than the amount of grant funds requested.
- Local education agencies (LEAs) must agree to fully participate in program
 evaluation and submit evidence of program outcomes and results, including visual
 documentation, such as short video clips or photo evidence of program
 implementation when requested by the ADE.
- The ADE is requiring that LEAs sign a Social Emotional Learning (SEL) attestation form (unless on file) found in the LEA Document Library in FY2024.
