



McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act

### SEA Subgrant Requirements



#### Annual Allocation from the USDE

- Based on the State's proportion of the Title I, Part I federal allocation
- Minimum of 75% must be subgranted to LEAs


Competitive Subgrant Process

- Competitive subgrant process occurs at least once every three (3) years
- FY27 will be the start of upcoming three-year EHCY Grant funding cycle
- Additional mini-grant opportunities may become available intermittently

Evaluation & Award Criteria

- Quality of proposed project
- Assessment of educational & related needs of students
- Ability of applicant to meet identified needs

## LEA Subgrant Requirements



### **Allowable Uses of EHCY Funds**

- Supplement, not supplant
- Eliminate barriers for children and youth experiencing homelessness:
  - Identification
  - Enrollment
  - Attendance
  - Academic success

#### 16 allowable activities

- Outreach and identification
- Immediate enrollment
- School stability
- Transportation
- Educational & wrap-around services



#### **Considerations**

#### Awards

- FY24 & FY25 final awards have been allocated to subgrantees
- Subgrantees are encouraged to utilize all funds within the source fiscal year to meet the needs of students experiencing homelessness

#### Completion Reports

 Must be submitted within 90 days of the close of the original project period

#### Carryover

- Carryover from the previous FY will be added to current FY allocation upon approval of the previous FY's Completion Report
- The larger the carryover amount, the greater likelihood there may be an increase to subgrantee risk assessments
  - The risk assessment is partially determined by the total carryover from all grant applications within the fiscal year

**Approximating Award Amount Example** 

### (Division Allocation) + (F/R%) + (Homeless % Tier) = Approximated Allocation Award

**Base Allocation** 

Base Allocation = 12,000

The base allocation amount is also used to determine incremental changes below.

### **Funding Formula**

The formula below can be used to calculate the **maximum** amount of funding an applicant may be eligible to be awarded. Official awards are dependent on the quality of the grant application and the amount that the USDE awards ADE to subgrant to LEAs

LEA B reported 3,000 students enrolled as of October 1, 2024, a 40% free and reduced lunch rate, and 7% homelessness rate.


- 3,000 students enrolled = Division I = \$12,000 base allocation
- **40% F/R%** = Tier II = + (\$12,000 x 2) = \$24,000
- **7% Homeless %** = Tier II = + (\$12,000 x 2) = \$24,000
- \$12,000 + \$24,000 + \$24,000
- Approximate Award Amount to Budget: \$60,000

### **Stakeholders**

When preparing the FY26 EHCY Continuation Grant application, consult with multiple stakeholders to ensure well-rounded analysis of need, effective programming, and avoid supplanting



## Additional Considerations

Identification is critical to the success of both students and local programs

### **Additional Considerations**

#### Cover excess cost to remove the barriers to ...

- Identification, retention, attendance, and academic success
  - Increased staff capacity stipends & salaries
  - Contracts w/CBOs
- School retention and attendance
  - Provision of transportation
  - Contracts w/CBOs or vendors
- Academic success
  - Paying AP exam , SAT/ACT, and dual-enrollment fees
- Identification and immediate enrollment
  - Acquiring previous academic records, birth certificates, and immunization records

### **Additional Considerations**

#### **ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES**

- Transportation
- Tutoring services, shelters or other locations where homeless students live
- Parental involvement specifically oriented to reaching out to parents of homeless students
- Student fees that are necessary to participate in the general education program
- Personal school supplies
- Extended learning time (before and after school
- Saturday classes, summer school, etc.) to compensate for lack of quiet time for homework in shelters or other overcrowded living conditions
- Fees for Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB) testing;
- Fees for college entrance exams such as the SAT or ACT
- GED testing for school-age students

#### **NON-ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES**

- Clothing and shoes necessary to participate in physical education classes
- Medical and dental services
- Eyeglasses and hearing aids
- Immunizations
- Food
- Outreach services to students living in shelters, motels, and other temporary residences
- Counseling services to address anxiety related to homelessness that is impeding learning;
- Birth certificates necessary to enroll in school

# Program Narrative Responses



#### **Data Clarification**

- District-approved standards-based benchmark assessments <u>do not</u> include the following:
  - Required State Assessments
    - i.e., AASA, ACT Aspire, AzSCI, etc.
  - ACT & SAT
  - Teacher-made assessments & class grades
- Course grades may be used for grades 9-12 to demonstrate academic outcomes

#### **Stakeholder Clarification**

 Program narrative question #10 requires a description of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaison's active role in the decision-making process

### Program Narrative Responses



#### **Responses to Narrative Questions**

- Carefully review the responses from the previous grant application
- Build on the previous grant application's responses
  - Acknowledge what has been accomplished
  - Address how needs were met
- Describe how you intend to continue, expand or change the service to meet the current needs of students experiencing homelessness

#### **Academic and Non-Instructional Goals**

- Carefully review the Academic and Non-Instructional Goals established in the previous grant application
- Revise, enhance or change the goals to meet the current needs of students experiencing homelessness







# Proposed activities must be in alignment with the following:

- Needs & goals identified in the program narrative questions
- Documentation uploaded into the Related Documents


### **Budget Requirements**





# Services must be "reasonable and necessary"

- Must be supported by data



#### Funds used as a last resort when funds or services are not available from other public or private sources

- Grant funds are supplemental
- All other resource options, including local funds, community-based resources, must be used first

### Budget Narrative Requirements



### **Ensure Funds are Supplemental**

#### Clearly include the following:

- No other funds are available for the expenditure
- Expenditure is exclusively to meet needs of students experiencing homelessness
- Services or supplies are not provided for students who are not experiencing homelessness from other sources
- Data used to determine need
  - Number of homeless students anticipated to benefit from the expenditure
- Responsibilities of staff receiving stipends
  - Ensure the responsibilities are performed <u>outside</u> the employee's normal contract hours
- Board-approved job descriptions uploaded into Related Documents for all salaried (FTE) positions
- Dissemination process and safeguards ensuring expenditures are used for intended purpose

#### Board-approved job descriptions for grantfunded salary positions

#### Vendor contracts paid from grant funds

 Including documents detailing all instructional and non-instructional contracted services scheduled for the school year and summer learning sessions

"Collaborations within the Community" Document

FY26 EHCY consortium subgrantee must upload the following documents into the Related Documents

- Updated Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)
   Reflecting current funding amount for each member
- Certification & Assurances for each member




