

What we know

Current funding & spending remains on track

FY25 July 1, 2024 - September 30, 2025

- Title I Allocation = \$7,196,924.69
- Title II Allocation = \$793,378.91



Projected budgets and grant applications for FY26 (2025-2025 school year) will be available on April 1, 2025 (prior years March 1)

Allocations impacted by:

- Poverty Counts Census Bureau
 (AZ had slight increase)
- DistrictEnrollment
- Increase in # of Charter Schools
- Changes at the Federal level

Preliminary Allocations for next year:

FY26 July 1, 2025 - September 30, 2026

Title I Allocation = 20% decrease

This amount will be updated based on federal budget once passed.

Title II Allocation = ??

Next Steps

We are moving forward with Federal requirements:

- Schools are conducting Comprehensive Needs Assessments (CNA) and building Integrated Action Plans (IAP) in preparation for the upcoming school year.
- District Level Integrated Action Plan
- Private School Consultations enrollment holding steady
- Tribal Consultations
