Statement by Parent: My daughter is bored in class. What are you going to do to keep her engaged?

As the facilitator, how would you respond?

Scenario #3

The student has been misbehaving in class. The teacher shared with the parents that the student is having problems with her peers. A meeting has been scheduled to discuss her behavior and how to find a solution to it.

Statement by Parent: My daughter said she is being bullied by kids in class. What are you going to do to protect her?

As the facilitator, how would you respond?
